








#### **Social Justice Donation Made**

St. John the Baptist and St. James the Less recently donated the Easter Collection of \$1,112.00 to the North Lee Co. Food Pantry in Ft. Madison.

This is our way to support the call of the Catholic Church to support social justice in our community. Msgr. Marvin Mottet was a remarkable priest and social justice innovator. Although he was born on a farm in rural lowa at a time when Catholics were often an untrusted minority, he went on to become a promoter of Social Action. He brought many national justice figures to Davenport, lowa, such as Caesar Chavez, Martin Luther King, Jr, and Mother Teresa, to inspire action by others.



The Two Feet in the title of his book "How To Change The World Two Feet At A Time", refers to his concept that to move forward in life, and in social justice, we need two feet: 1) charity to meet immediate needs of people, and 2) social change to address the causes of people's needs.

Our donation to the Food Pantry meets the need in #1. When we participate in the "Walk for Life" and such rallies, we can fulfill #2.


